Constitution

- > To provide a common voice for all Black Powder Shooters in the Province.
- > To encourage development of the old skills and trades related to Black Powder.
- > To co-ordinate activities of the Black Powder Shooters in the Province.
- > To provide education relating to the use of black powder firearms.

Activities

The SBPA has been a *strong 'Provincial Voice'* supporting responsible use and preservation of firearms in Saskatchewan. The SBPA is a strong force that offers support and negotiations for *'causes'* that promote shooting sports in Saskatchewan—protecting our way of life.

The *Association* has a strong network of qualified black powder instructors enthusiasts that will work with your organization to assist with firearm safety courses, demonstrations and workshops.

The SBPA has membership on the Saskatchewan Wildlife Advisory Committee. This committee meets annually to discuss wildlife management issues and concerns and to aid the Saskatchewan Environment and Resource Management (SERM) to develop sustainable wildlife management practice.

HUNTING TROPHY SYSTEM available to members who are fortunate to bag the largest species of game—big game and birds—hunnable within the boundaries of Saskatchewan.

COMPETITIVE SHOOTING TROPHY SYSTEM Awards for men, women and children for various ranges, shotgun events and more traditional kife and hawk events.

Hunting Trophy Regulations

General

- > Game must be legally taken and tagged (where applicable) by the SBPA member in good standing.
- > Fair Chase Rules apply (re: Saskatchewan Wildlife Federation scoring affidavit)
- > Species must be legally hunted within the boundaries of Saskatchewan
- > An affidavit stating the species of animal/bird, date and zone of kill signed by 3 current SBPA members will normally be deemed sufficient proof of kill.
- > The SBPA reserves the right to request additional proof until the SBPA is satisfied that the animal or bird was taken within the guideline's of the scoring system outlined below.
- > Entries to be delivered to the SBPA address not later than 31 December of the year following the close of the hunting seasons.
- > Trophies will be awarded at the Annual Awards Banquet.

Big Game

- > Muzzle loading rifle only.
- > Rack (or head) to be measured by an accredited measurer.
- > The highest scoring rack/head in each event shall determine the winner.
- > Non-typical are those racks with 10% or more non-typical points.
- > Proof of kill indicated by a copy of the validated tag (or copy of the habitat permit and date of kill)

- > The big game scoring system is based on the Boone and Crocket System. A Hunter of the Year event has been established, where a hunter is awarded a number of points for each animal taken. The scoring system for Hunter of the Year is as follows:

White-tailed Deer	100 + score over 135
Non-typical	100 + score over 155
Mule Deer	125 + score over 145
Non-typical	125 + score over 170
Elk	150 + score over 275
Moose	125 + score over 150
Bear	75 plus 1 pt for each 1/16" over 16"
Antelope	125 +score over 45

Game Birds

- > Muzzle loading shotgun only.
- > Bird to be weighed on a government approved scale and the weight sheet include the full name, address, phone number and signature of the weigher.
- > The heaviest bird in each event shall determine the winner.
- > Events are for each species of game bird and migratory birds legally hunted within the boundaries of Saskatchewan. These include:
 - > Ptarmigan
 - > Ruffed Grouse
 - > Spruce Grouse
 - > Sharp-tailed Grouse
 - > Hungarian Partridge
 - > Duck
 - > Goose
 - > Sandhill Crane
 - > Pheasant
